SCOUTMASTER'S INFORMATION SHEET

- AUTOMOBILES:** Cars should be parked in the parking lot. They should never be used to drive around camp or to transport Scouts in camp. If an emergency arises, we will be glad to use a camp vehicle.
- LANTERNS:** Propane and liquid fuel lanterns are not to be used by the campers. Leaders may use them, but we would prefer that they use only battery powered lanterns, if possible. There is a special storage area for gas, kerosene, etc.
- DINING HALL:** Be sure that you send waiters to the dining hall twenty minutes before each meal. Please teach the boys that the Scout sign means silence.
- FLAG CEREMONIES:** Retreat will be held daily (except Wednesday) at 5:45 and on Saturday at 9:30. Morning Colors will be held on Monday at 7:45. All troops should be present for these ceremonies and should be lined up properly so that they may start on time. Your troop may volunteer to run one of these ceremonies. The troop should conduct their own retreat before the camp-wide ceremony.
- TROOP GOOD TURNS:** Each troop is assigned an area to police or clean each day of the week. Please make sure that your troop follows this schedule. The schedule will be given to you upon arrival.
- LATRINES:** For health and happiness of all, it is essential that the campsite latrine be cleaned daily. The pine oil and toilet paper are available in the Craftshop. The brushes are in the latrines.
- CONSERVATION:** Please be careful of the trees in each site. Please do NOT cut any trees. If any tree is endangering your site or trail, please report it to the office.
- COMMISSIONER SERVICE:** Each unit will be assigned a commissioner. His job is to help you and your unit and to work with the junior leaders in camp to coordinate camp-wide events. If you need suggestions for programs, if you need equipment, or have any problems, consult your commissioner and he will assist you. Feel free to consult him at any time.
- INSPECTION:** An inspection of your site will be conducted each day by your commissioner. The results will be left with the Scoutmaster and will be posted in the dining hall at the evening meal.
- CAMPFIRES:** There will be two campwide campfires - Sunday at 7:45 and Friday at 8:15. Parents may be invited to the Friday night campfire. Troops are encouraged to have their own campfires during the week. You may personally invite any staff member to attend or go through your commissioner.
- MERIT BADGE APPROVAL:** All Scouts must present a signed Merit Badge Approval Form to his counselor (forms in back of this booklet). This indicates that you have given the Scout your approval. At the end of the week we will supply the merit badge cards. Work smart and prepare the forms before arriving at camp.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR '84

Junior Leader Training Workshop - A week long Junior Leader Training Workshop will be conducted at 11:15 - 12:05 each day. The course is geared to improving leadership skills and may serve as an introductory training course or a refresher. Participants must be 13 years of age and at least First Class. A certificate will be awarded to those who complete the course. Remember you can never have too much training.

Snorkeling BSA - This National BSA program is a week long course designed to introduce Scouts to the special skills, equipment and safety precautions associated with snorkeling. Participants must be at least 13 years of age and have Swimming Merit Badge. A certificate and a patch will be awarded to those who complete the course.



BSA Lifeguard - This special award can be earned by Scouts who can demonstrate outstanding aquatic skills. The course runs Monday - Thursday at 2:15 - 3:05 and will require additional time throughout the week. Scouts who complete the requirements will be awarded a BSA Lifeguard Certificate and patch. Swimming Merit Badge and Lifesaving Merit Badge must have been earned previously. Scouts should talk with the Aquatic Director about the requirements.

First Aid Merit Badge will be offered from 7:00 - 8:30 P.M. daily. We offer this badge for Scouts who desperately need this badge and cannot, for some reason earn it back home. This badge is very time consuming and we ask Scoutmasters to use their discretion when signing Scouts up for this badge since most younger Scouts can make better use of the time. First Aid Skill Award is a prerequisite and all Scouts will first be reviewed on the Skill Award material.



First Aid

The following merit badges on the camp schedule are required for Eagle: Environmental Science, Camping, Personal Fitness (or Swimming or Sports), Lifesaving. Scouts taking part in these merit badges at camp are encouraged to review the requirements and do any preparation for some of the requirements before attending camp.

Camping Merit Badge and Skill Award - both badges require two overnights. Camping M.B. will camp out on Tuesday and Wednesday evening. Camping Skill Award will also camp out on Tuesday and Wednesday evening (after program hours).

Scouts taking Camping Merit Badge and Skill Award should bring a trail tent to camp with them.

TROOP ACTIVITIES AT CAMP HINDS

SPORTS

- Open Shoots Scouts may use the Rifle Range with no prior sign-up.
- Troop Shoots
(Archery Range) Your troop can sign up to use the archery range. Times available are 2:15 - 3:05, 3:15 - 4:05, and 4:15 - 5:05.
- Action Archery Action archery is an archery course set up in the woods with animal targets. This is an alternative to a troop shoot.
- Competitive Sports We have the facilities for softball, soccer, basketball, volleyball and rugby.

SCOUTCRAFT

- Hobo Cooking Learn to cook like a hobo using a tin can for a stove, or cooking with only nature's utensils.
- Toten Chip Every Scout should have a toten chip card. The Scoutcraft Department offers a course in the proper use and care of knives, axes and saws.
- Knot Tying The Scoutcraft Department will provide a staff member to review and teach knots from the basics to the most difficult.
- Hikes If you desire a hike while you are at Camp Hinds, check with the Scoutcraft Department. (There are two hikes a week sponsored by the Scoutcraft Department for hiking skill award.)
- Camp Living Learn new and useful tips on how to live more comfortably in the outdoors.
- Dutch Oven Cooking Learn how to cook like a chef using a dutch oven. Try it, you'll like it.
- Compass and Map Reading Learn how to use a map and compass more effectively or ask the Scoutcraft Department to set a compass course up for you.
- Scoutcraft Competition The Scoutcraft Department will set up a course for patrol competitions within the troop, or challenge another troop. This competition uses skills such as knot tying, fire building, log sawing, log rolling, etc.
- Paul Bunyan Award A staff member of the Scoutcraft Department will supervise your Scouts and will assist them in earning the Paul Bunyan Award.

The Scoutcraft Department will be more than happy to assist you in any scoutcraft related activity - just ask them.

NATURE DEPARTMENT

- Scavenger Hunt The staff of the Nature Department will prepare a scavenger hunt for your troop, consisting mostly of nature objects. Learn and have fun.
- Nature Hikes A staff member in the Nature Department will guide your troop through the "wilds" of Camp Hinds. Learn edible plants, tree identification, animal tracks, as well as seeing how beautiful Camp Hinds really is.
- Merit Badges If any Scout in your troop is interested in a nature related Merit Badge not offered in the morning, send him to the Nature Area to make an appointment with one of the counselors.
- Skill Awards Sign your troop up for instruction in one of the Nature related skill awards.

- Aquatic Games An alternate to the troop swim. Available at 2:15.
- Special Aquatic Activity A different and special aquatic activity will be held every day at 2:15.
- Troop Swims Sign your troop up for a daily swim. Troop swims are one-half hour periods. Why not sign up for an early morning swim, at 7:00 A.M.
- Safe Swims Your troop can sign up to use the safe swim area. Run a swim just as you would on a troop outing.
- Free Boating Canoeing, sailing, and row boats are available for your use. Times available: 2:15 - 5:05 and 7:00 - 8:00.
- Competitions Competitive sports available on the waterfront are: Basketball, Volleyball, Water Polo, and Watermelon Tussles. Why not challenge another troop, it's fun! Times available: 7:00 - 7:30 and 7:30 - 8:00.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Canoe Trips - Troops that would like an overnight canoe trip may sign up Sunday night. A leader 21 or older must accompany the boys and one leader for every ten boys. Additional leaders may be 18. All boys and leaders must be a swimmer. A Safety Afloat plan is offered prior to departure.

Safe Swim Instruction - This program is a half hour for the leaders and boys who want to learn, run, and be certified in running a safe swim. Certificates will be given to leaders upon completion of the training experience.

Safety Afloat - This program is a half hour which will promote boating and safety and to set standards for safe unit activities. Instructions are given at Chipmunk point any afternoon between 3:15 - 4:45.

Lifesaving Merit Badge - Either Tuesday or Wednesday evening Scouts will need to become certified in C.P.R. to fulfill the requirement in Lifesaving Merit Badge. This badge will also meet Wednesday afternoon, 2:15, at the waterfront.

Water Skiing and Motorboating Merit Badge - Due to operating costs and the availability of just one speedboat, Water Skiing Merit Badge is restricted to Scouts who have all other aquatic badges. The fee is \$1.50 per run. Motorboating Merit Badge is open to any Scout who is a swimmer. The fee is \$2.00 for the week.

Swim Tests - All swim tests will be given Sunday afternoon between 2:00 and 4:00. Any left overs will be able to take their tests Monday morning at 9:00. PLEASE - do not ask for a swim test during instructional periods or troop swims.

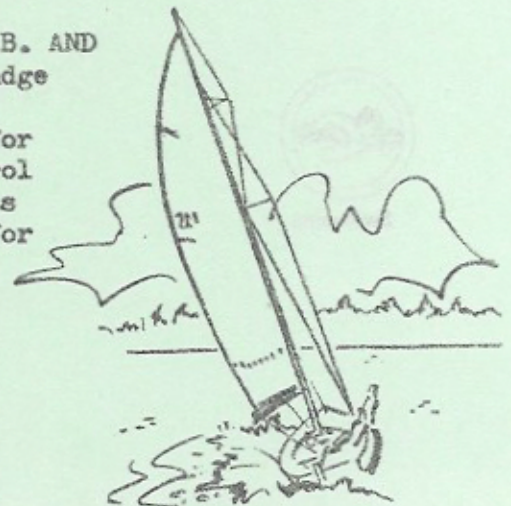
Troop Swim Leadership - Each troop is required to have a leader at least 21 years of age or older present at troop functions that are at the waterfront area. Under no circumstances will Scouts be allowed to swim if a leader is not present. Notify the Aquatic Director if this is impossible.

Sailing - Use of sailboats is limited to Scouts who have completed the smallboat sailing instruction (2:15 Monday), or have Sailing Merit Badge.

AQUATIC CAMPS

AUGUST 5 - 11

Advanced Aquatic Camp designed for Scouts who have attended one of the Aquatic Camps in years past. Scouts must be 13 years of age and have previously earned Swimming and Lifesaving Merit Badge. This is a challenging course geared toward older Scouts. Maximum sign up is limited to 20 Scouts. BSA Lifeguard, Snorkeling BSA and CPR Certificates will be awarded to all who complete the course.

Inquire with the Aquatic Director while you are at camp if some of your Scouts are interested or preregister with the Service Center.



AUGUST 12 - 18

Regular Aquatic Camp for Scouts who are interested in a weeklong course in aquatics. All aquatic related merit badges can be earned plus many special aquatic skills, activities, and demonstrations. Sign up is limited to 40 Scouts. Special announcements will be made during camp regarding both aquatic camps. If you will not be going to camp as a troop until these dates, please make sure that any Scouts interested in one of the aquatic camps pre-registers for the program.
