

PTC Property Rentals

Rental opportunities are now open for this fall and 2009 season. Rental opportunities at all of our camps include campsites, cabins and the Training Center Lodge at Camp Hinds. These rentals are open to all Scout groups.

To reserve, check availability with Kathy Higgins at PTC @ $797-5252 \times 32$, complete a Property Use Form and send in with the fee to PTC.

Weekend rental fees range from \$30 for a campsite for up to 20 people, \$50 - \$65 for a rustic cabin with sleeping space from 16—28 people to the Messer Training Center that has a commercial kitchen, hot showers, and sleeping bays for up to 48! Non-Scout groups can also rent the facilities at a different rate.

Due to the increase in fuel cost, the rental price for the Messer Training Center at Hinds will be going up to \$350 per weekend (holds 48 people!) effective Jan. 1, 2009

Groups who do not leave their rental in a "Scout-like" manner will be charged a minimum \$25 cleaning fee.

It's time to start planning for the 2009 Camp-In Program at the Boston Museum of Science. The cost is \$51.00 per person. (Please note: The Museum charges a fee of \$5 per car for people parking in the Museum garage during the Camp-In.) **The event is limited to CUB SCOUTS and ADULTS only. Siblings and unregistered youth cannot attend – no exceptions**! In order to provide an equal opportunity for all of our Packs to participate in the Boston Museum trip, please follow the guidelines below.

Application Procedure

Each Pack must submit a deposit of \$15 for each person who plans to attend. Please send a check made payable to Pine Tree Council, along with the registration coupon below. Phone applications **will not** be accepted.

All applications must be received at the Pine Tree Council by the end of the business day on November 13, 2008. Please do not request reservations for more slots than you actually plan to use (**for those who are selected, deposits are nonrefundable.**) A drawing will be held on November 14th. Those who were selected from the drawing will be notified, and the remaining payment and confirmation of number of participants will be due at the Pine Tree Council by January 16, 2009, end of business day. Any reserved slots not paid in full by this date will be lost and offered to those on the waiting list (**again, the initial deposit for those selected is nonrefundable**.) Those Packs not selected will also be notified and deposits will be returned.

Once participants are confirmed, the Pine Tree Council is required to pay for those spaces. It is the policy of the Boston Museum of Science not to grant refunds to anyone who does not participate in the Camp-In, unless the MUSEUM cancels the event.

Matt Miller, Troop 317, participated in the Counselor in Training (CIT) program at Camp Hinds. The CIT program is three weeks long and is for 15 year old Boy Scouts that are interested in finding out more about summer camp and working on camp staff. Here are some comments from Matt about his summer !

What was the best part of being a CIT?

The best part for me was meeting new people and seeing what goes on other than the stuff scouts see when they come to camp. I enjoyed spending more time at Camp Hinds than I ever have before in one summer.

What was your favorite area or job that you had a camp as a CIT?

Oh, my favorite most definitely was a multi-tie between aquatics, shooting sports, and helping out Sunday before the campers arrived. Aquatics and shooting sports most people like, and I am one of those people. But not everyone likes the hard work that comes with Sundays. I loved being able to make the campsites livable and clean for new scouts.

What was the worst job you were given?

The worst job I had was actually out of one of the areas I loved. I was helping out at boating, and the group we had during the last morning period would not listen at all. It was really frustrating how we couldn't get them to listen to us. But because of that, I understand and respect what the staff has to deal with sometimes.

What were some of the things you learned as a CIT?

I learned most of the responsibilities of normal staff (most of which I never knew of) and I learned that when you teach a group of kids, you may have to change your teaching ways to help different kids learn different rules and skills.

Why should others become a CIT?

I think that anyone who can should become a CIT. It is a wonderful experience. You'll meet new people from all over the council (and sometimes out of council). But the biggest reason to become a CIT is because it's fun.

- Have been active in a troop or team for at least six months prior to July 1, 2010
- be approved by his Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach.


Weekend 2008:
