One of the most memorable experiences a youth will have participating in the Scouting Program will be the time they spend at camp. Summer Resident Camp, the National Jamboree, Philmont, NYLT or for Scout Backs to use at the PTC store or our camps trading post! These opportunities allow for growth, leadership development, team building, trust, camaraderie and good, clean old FUN!

We realize that with the rising prices of food and gasoline, coupled with the busy lives we all live, finding the resources to fund a Scout's way to camp can be a challenge. This spring we are proud to offer our <u>"Earn Your Way To Camp"</u> popcorn campaign to help our families in the Pine Tree Council find the means to send their Scouts to a camp.

Here is how the program will work:

- Every Registered Scout is eligible to participate in the program!
- The Sale will start March 1st, 2010 and the orders will be due to the Pine Tree Council by April 23rd, 2010. Once you have your sales guide, you may begin selling popcorn.
- The Sale will be a Take-Order sale, conducted individually by each Scout and their family. THIS
 WILL NOT BE A TROOP or PACK RUN SALE. You can request additional Take-Order sheets
 from the Pine Tree Council at any time during the sale.
- Each boy will receive a 35% commission on all popcorn sold, given in the form of a Voucher for the amount earned valid for use at any PINE TREE COUNCIL camping program, National Jamboree, Philmont or Sea Base treks sponsored by PTC program (not Out of Council camps).
- The popcorn you sell will be available on May 8th, 2010 at Barber Foods, 56 Milliken St.
 Portland, Maine. It will be the responsibility of each Scout and family to come pick up the popcorn.
 Pick Up will be from 8 11 AM.
- Your popcorn bill is to be paid by May 21st, 2010. Bills paid after the 21st of May will be charged a 10% late fee. Checks need to be made payable to the *PINE TREE COUNCIL*, *BSA*. Operation Fly 1st Class is Pine Tree Council program being offered for Boy Scouts up to age 13, Scout rank to First Class! This four-day program will offer new Boy Scouts the opportunity for advancement during the April school vacation with other Scouts under the guidance of older Scouts and experienced leaders!

Program Features to include: Cooking, Woods tools, 1st aid, Camp Gadgets, Outdoor Code, Leave No Trace, Native Plants & Wildlife, an overnight outdoor adventure, orienteering, service project, flags & ceremonies, Scout's Own Service, and plenty of Scout Spirit!

Operation Fly 1st Class will be held at Camp Hinds in Raymond. The cost is \$160 per Scout and includes all meals, program equipment, and accommodations in the Training Center, experienced adult & older boy leadership! The program will be set up like a real troop with patrols and adult leadership. The staff will fill the roles of Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters, Senior Patrol Leader and patrol leaders to insure a great quality program. Program is limited to 32 Scouts per session and filled up early last year!

What is Friends of Scouting?

One of the questions I often hear is, "Why do we do Family Friends of Scouting?" Well, there are a lot of reasons. The most obvious answer is that it allows those that benefit directly from the Scouting program the opportunity to support it financially. The word "opportunity" may be the most important word in that answer. I know that I take great pride in being able to support charities. I personally feel it is my duty as someone that can give, to give. I try to instill those same values in my son and daughter. That is why I use the word "opportunity". Giving is truly an opportunity to make one's mark, or leave a lasting legacy.

Family FOS also affords another opportunity. That is the opportunity to get out and tell the Scouting story. Many families do not get to see the big picture of Scouting. They see Scouting as a church basement or a Legion hall. When in fact, there is an entire world of Scouting beyond that. More informed families make for an all around better program for the boys. When families realize the full scope of this movement we call the Boy Scouts of America, they are more apt to understand the need for, and value of, volunteering at the local level. No one has enough volunteers! So we do Family FOS to help fund the program, but also to give all of our family's the opportunity to hear the story, and decide what they can do for Scouting!

Finally, FOS is vital to the operation of the Council as it accounts for 20% of the annual budget, a budget from which 90% of expenses are spent directly on Program Expense.

The Friends of Scouting Honor Unit Program

For the 2010 Friends of Scouting Family campaign, the Pine Tree Council will again be running the Honor Unit Program designed to reward those Packs, Troops and Crews that make a significant contribution to the FOS program. Any unit that qualifies will receive one free cloth badge of rank from the Council service center free of charge!

Here's how a unit qualifies. Each unit will be given a goal. The goal is calculated based upon the number of youth registered at the time of the presentation. Please also note that a unit may reach its goal in pledges, but has not qualified until **all payments of pledges are received by August 31, 2010**. Honor Unit Status will then be effective September 1, 2010 - August 31, 2011.

The Patch

It costs the Pine Tree Council \$160 per youth member to provide a quality Scouting program to youth of Southern, Central and Western Maine. We will again be offering a commemorative Council shoulder patch for any person that gives a gift sponsoring one or more Scouts.





Health Forms

All adults and youth attending a FunPack Weekend must have a completed Class 1 Medical form on file. The Health Form includes emergency phone numbers, parental/guardian permission to treat and a health history.

PTC Refund Policy

Individuals or groups that cancel a program reservation 30 days prior to the date of the event will receive a refund of fees paid less a 15% administrative charge. No refunds will be made after the 30-day cancellation period.

Physically Challenged Information

If you have any needs that require special attention, auxiliary aids or any reasonable accommodations, please let us know at least two weeks prior to your arrival at camp.

Directions to Camp Hinds, 146 Plains Road, Raymond. Plains Road is between Route 85 and 121, both of which intersect Routes 302 and 11. From the Maine Turnpike-

Take exit 63 Gray off the Maine Turnpike, Turn left onto Route 202, and turn right onto Rt. 26A, go 2.6 miles and turn left onto North Raymond Road (by Dry Mills Store), go 1 mile and turn left onto Egypt Road, at end of Egypt Road, take right onto Route 85, go 1.8 miles, past schools and down a large hill, turn left onto Plains Road and Camp Hinds is .3 miles on the left.








Tiger Cubs, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts, and Webelos Scouts have the opportunity to earn the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award. Boys may earn the award in each of the program years as long as the requirements are completed each year. The first time the award is earned, the boy will receive the pocket flap award (shown above), which is to be worn on the right pocket flap of the uniform shirt. Each successive time the award is earned, a wolf track pin (also shown above) may be added to the flap. Leaders should encourage boys to build on skills and experiences from previous years when working on the award for a successive year.

HOW TO SIGN UP FOR CAMP:

To Reserve a Troop campsite: Scoutmasters should call the Pine Tree Council, at 207-797-5252 x 14, to confirm a week and campsite. Camp space is limited so reserve early. To hold your campsite the reservation fee is \$10.00 per Scout.

To sign up for a provisional week: Parents need to use the 2010 Provisional Scout registration form and send it to PTC. Forms are available on our website or by calling PTC at 797-5252.

Parents and Scouts should check with their Scoutmaster to find out the troops summer camp plans and attend with your troop. If unable to go with the troop or want to attend additional weeks of camp, use the Provisional Scout registration form to sign up for provo camp or a specialty program.




CAMP STAFF:

Our camp has a trained staff of Scouts and adults. Our camp staff are registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and our mission is to help promote the aims and methods of Boy Scouting, to their fullest, here at Camp Hinds.

The camp is lead by the Camp Director who works with the Program Director. Each of our program and support areas are overseen by an Area Director, many of whom have attended the BSA National Camping School program for training specific to their job. Our health lodge is fully staffed 24 hours a day with licensed medical personnel, assisted by our on-call camp physician Dr. Don Burgess.






Pine Tree Council Philmont Trek 2011


