



Pine Tree Council Philmont Trek 2011: As in 2009, the Pine Tree Council will be sending a contingent of Scouts and Scouters to the Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, NM in 2011. We will be sending 24 participants including leaders on the trek from June 25-July 11, 2011. Participants must be in good physical shape and be at least 14 years of age by January 1, 2011.

Our trek will be a backpacking expedition for 12 days and nights through the Sangre de Cristo Mountains of Philmont Scout Ranch ranging in elevation up to 12,441 feet. Discover the wonder of this scouting paradise by traveling with the Pine Tree Council contingent.

A deposit of \$100.00 per person is required to secure a reservation for this trek ASAP If you want a spot!

Mandatory Youth Protection Training -

As of June 1st, 2010 any registered leader with a scouting unit MUST have current Youth Protection Training. This includes ANY leader registered with the unit except the Chartering Organization Head. In September of 2010, every unit in the Pine Tree Council will receive their Annual Recharter Packets. Each unit will be, from 2010 onward, rechartering their unit in the month of December.

Your unit WILL NOT be able to register any leader who has not completed Youth Protection Training this December, 2010 and your unit will not be able to recharter unless you have the minimum number of leaders Youth Protection Trained. What you need for recharter is as follows -Committee Chairman Chartering Organization Head Chartering Organization Rep. Member of Committee #1

Member of Committee #2

Den Leader (Pack's Only)

Cub Master/Scout Master/Venture Crew Leader

There are many ways you can get all of your leaders trained in Youth Protection by December, 2010.

Please contact your District Training Team, Commissioner Staff, or District Executive to take advantage of any of these opportunities/methods to receive training

Take the training Online VIA

www.myscouting.org. Print the certificiate at the end of the training and submit it with your charter, and you keep a copy for your records.

Have a Pack Trainer, Commissioner, or District Training Team Member visit your unit and train your leaders in Youth Protection. Make sure you fill out a Training Attendance Record and attach a copy of the Training Attendance Record to your charter, and keep a copy for the unit.

Attend a Council or District Training this fall and receive Youth Protection Training. Attach a photocopy of the Trained Card you will recieve to your charter.

Be advised that any NEW leader that your unit wishes to register must ALSO take Youth Protection Training and attach a copy of the completed training to their application before they will be accepted into the organization. New leaders can take training by visiting www.myscouting.org and create an account WITH OUT a membership ID number. This function will allow a new leader access to the Youth Protection Training only, and they must print off a copy of their certificate after completion and attach it to their application – and keep a copy for the unit.

This new policy is our way of doing all that we can to ensure that the leaders wer are accepting to work with our youth are of the highest caliber. We understand that as we implement this new policy this fall that we will need to be patient and flexible in order to make the rechartering process this December a success. DO NOT WAIT until December to get your leadership trained in Youth Protection. IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ask a District Trainer, Commissioner, or your District Executive for help. There are many ways to train your leaders, you just need to ask for help when you need it.

www.myscouting.org is a wonderful resource and the quickest way to get your leaders trained. Make sure they have their membership ID number and encourage them to take the training online this summer. Ask for copies of their training certificates and keep them on file with your unit.

In order to ensure a great sale in 2010, please be aware of the following resources and activities designed to support your unit –

Visit the 2010 Popcorn Facebook Page for Pine Tree Council and become a member. We will be posting tips, ideas, resources, and dates on this page begining in July. It is also intended to be a tool for units to use to talk to each other, share ideas, and ask questions. You can reach the page by going to <u>WWW.Pinetreebsa.org</u> and clicking on the "Popcorn Facebook" button at the top of the page.

Each unit will be receiving a Popcorn Kick Off Kit and Leader Playbook this year (with sales dates and contact information). They should be in the office during the month of July. When the kits arrive all the units on our E-mail list will be contacted. If you can not pick up your kit at the office, they will be available at your District Program Launch this August. Please contact your District Leadership for more information on the date, time, and location of your program launch.

If you want to be added to the Popcorn E-Mail List, go to <u>www.Trails-End.com</u> and update your unit's profile information, with an accurate e-mail address.

Flyers for the 2010 Sale will be mailed to each Scout during the first week of August. They may begin selling popcorn once they receive their flyer. Don't forget about the Online Sales resource for Scouts to use as well.

Hold a Popcorn Sale Planning meeting this summer. Figure out what you need to raise for funds to do programming in 2010, break that number into a per-scout goal, and plan from there. Once you know what you need it is easier to make a plan to reach that amount. Your District Popcorn Kernel and District Executive are both available to help you with this process.

Unit Show and Sell Orders will be due to the council by August 27th by 5 pm. Please keep this date in mind.

BEASCOUT on <u>www.Myscouting.org</u> –

From 2010 onward perspective scouting families will be able to visit www.scouting.org and find a local unit by simply doing a search by their ZIP Code. The result of the search will be a google map of their town with the meeting locations of each of the local units marked by a pin on the map. When the family scrolls their mouse cursor over the pin, what will pop up will be the contact information, meeting location, time, etc. Of the unit in question. The family will then be able to contact the unit that best meets their needs VIA an email or phone, and it is the unit leader listed on the pin will receive these requests automatically. In order for this to work, the information for your unit that is listed must be accurate. Right now what is listed in the phone number and name of your Scout Master, Cub Master, or Venture Crew Leader – and that is based upon what is on record in the ScoutNet system. Each unit should access their unit's information for BEASCOUT and update it by the 2nd week in August, 2010 in preparation for the fall. To do this, the unit must do the following steps (right now only the Scout Master, Cub Master, or Venture Crew Leader can access the BEASCOUT account for your unit. Once they go into the system for the first time, they can add and change the folks who can access and maintain the account from that point forward) –

Go to www.myscouting.org and sign into your account. If you don't have an account, you need to create one.

Click on the BEASCOUT tab on the left side of the page.

Click on the MANAGE UNIT PIN tab at the top of the page.

Make the changes you need to in order to update the page and save the file.

This tool is designed as a resource for your unit to take advantage of. You can customize your unit's icon, post updates, etc. Play around with the sight and become comfortable with it.



PINE TREE COUNCIL ~ COUNCIL CAMPING AWARD

The Pine Tree Council ~ Council Camping Award was established to promote the use of the camping facilities at the Pine Tree Council Camps and to recognize those units that utilize at least four camps in their yearly program.

To qualify for the Council Camping Award a unit will need to have utilized 4 of the Pine Tree Council camps for a unit activity during a consecutive 12-month period. Activities must be for at least a 24-hour period, and each activity must be attended by no less that 25% of the registered youth in the unit.
