The new scouts will be able to redeem the Pinewood Derby Car coupon through March 30, 2009 at their local NAPA Store. The actual date and location for the York District Pinewood Derby will be known by the end of January, 2009.

Attention All Boy Scout Troops:

As it has been in the past, all troops re-charter in February. The troop charters will be passed out to the commissioners in December and you will be contacted to set a date to get the re-charter paperwork to you. Please note that in 2009 ALL re-chartering will again be done via the ON-LINE re-chartering program. There are NO Re-chartering forms in the re-chartering packets. A BLUE sheet listing the unit's On-line Rechartering Access Code is in each packet. The On-line re-chartering is very easy, quicker and you can do it anytime of the day. You will still have to print out the final re-chartering information, have it signed by your charter organization and unit leader. After all that is done, it must be passed into the PTC Service Center with the proper money due.
